I have been a lay servant since the early 1990's. While there have been some changes to the program along the years, the benefits and blessings have remained the same. I have enjoyed the many experiences I have had along the way. I first served at my former church, First United Methodist Church in South Norwalk. It was a small church so I had many opportunities to deliver sermons, be liturgist, teach, chair numerous committees as well as taking many interesting courses to improve my skills and knowledge. One of my favorite things was a year of Psalms most Sundays just prior to worship.

In March I took another course (along with Leslie) to maintain my certification at the Westport UMC. In preparation, I read THE UNITED METHODIST WAY, LIVING OUR BELIEFS by Kenneth Carder and as a special treat, we spend an hour on a conference call with the author.

We reviewed the Wesleyan doctrine and the Wesleyan Quadrilateral - which consists of Scripture, Tradition, Reason and Experience - as well as the history of American Methodism. What was most meaningful for me? The focus on the law of kindness brought by God, Love God and Love your neighbor as yourself; Condemn no man, think for yourself but leave judgement up to God; We all have universal redemption – free grace. I also love the tradition of doing and seeking justice – do no harm, no not injure and always stay in love with God because He always loves us unconditionally.

As Pastor Kristina would say, the longer I spend living my faith, the more blessings I find on the journey.

MAY IS NATIONAL LYME DISEASE MONTH

Symptoms

Many people with early- stage lyme disease develop a distinctive circular rash at the site of the tick bite, usually around three to 30 days after being bitten. This is known as erythema migrans. The rash is often described as looking like a bull's- eye on a dart board.

Some of the common symptoms are as follows:

- Rashes
- Fever
- Chills
- Fatigue
- Headache



Symptoms of late- stage lyme disease:

- Numbness in hands and legs
- Arthritis
- Short term memory loss

Treatments

Early stages of lyme disease are treated with oral antibiotics.

Causes

Lyme disease is a tick- borne infection caused by four main species of bacteria carried primarily by certain species of ticks.

Remove Ticks the Right Way


Clean the area around the tick bite with rubbing alcohol.

Get your tweezers right down on your skin so you can grab as close as possible to the tick's head.

Pull up slow and firm. ...

Clean the bite area again, and your hands, with rubbing alcohol or soap and water.

Don't forget to check your pets! Your pets can get Lyme disease too, so check with your vet for an appropriate preventative.


